## CHANGES TO THE EAG COUNCIL

Every two years sees a rotation of the EAG Presidents on the Council. **Derek Vance** came to the end of his six years of presidential service at the end of 2024, with **Catherine Chauvel** moving into the Past-President's role for the next two years. **Dan Frost** began his two-year term as EAG President in January, and **Caroline Peacock**, Professor of Biogeochemistry at the University of Leeds, UK, was welcomed in as Vice-President after election to the position by the 2024 EAG Council.
