Welcome to Geochemical Perspectives, a new concept in publications. The journal will be issued quarterly and the single, peer-reviewed articles will be written by internationally renowned leaders. Each paper will present an overview of a major research area, written at a level that is accessible to people who are not experts in that field. However, in addition, we encourage authors to express personal perspectives and to recount their experiences about how ideas were generated and developed through time, and then, to go beyond the current state of the art, providing opinions about future directions and impact of their field. Geochemical Perspectives has been created by the European Association of Geochemistry for the

benefit of our community. In contrast to most journals in our field, which are produced to generate profit for publishing houses, Geochemical Perspectives has the single goal of promoting the communication of high-level science - but with a twist. It also aims to show the humanity of scientists and to paint pictures of the pathways trodden and the triumphs and frustrations that scientists meet along the way.


