Please note that, as agreed at the 2018 DMG general meeting in Bonn, membership fees have been raised slightly to cover the significant increase in administrative expenses.

DGMK/DMG/SGA SHORT COURSE

From Concept to Oil – The E&P Lifecycle 25–28 May 2020

The short course entitled From Concept to Oil – The E&P Lifecycle [E&P = exploration and production] is being supported by the Julius Maximilian University of Würzburg together with the DMG, Deutsche Wissenschaftliche Gesellschaft f. Erdöl, Erdgas und Kohle e.V. (DGMK; German Society for Petroleum and Coal Science and Technology) and the Society for Geology Applied to Mineral Deposits (SGA).

About the Course: The course aims to provide an overview of the full petroleum work cycle, from early exploration to the development and production of hydrocarbons. Topics of the course are geodynamics and basin formation, structural geology, source rocks and geochemistry, generation of oil and gas, sedimentology and the characteristics of petroleum reservoirs, the fundamentals of petroleum systems analysis and basin modelling, play-based exploration, the exploration–appraisal–development workflow, introduction to engineering disciplines, and technologies in exploration and production.

Requirements: The course is aimed at undergraduate students, PhD students, young professionals, and employees of the exploration and petroleum production industry with a geoscientific or petroleum engineering background who wish to learn about the fundamentals of the formation of sedimentary basins and petroleum deposits, i.e., anyone who needs to acquire a solid understanding of all the components of the exploration–production value chain and work cycle and the interfaces of the various exploration and production disciplines.

Participants may obtain two European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) credit points after completing the course and after passing a written examination. For students who do not wish to obtain an ECTS certificate, the examination is not required.

Instructors: Dr. Harald Karg of Wintershall Dea (GmbH) and Martin Nagel (MSc) of CNOOC International Limited.

Costs: €895 for delegates from industry who are members of the DMG, DGMK, and/or SGA.

€295 for delegates from academic institutions who are members of DMG, DGMK, and/or SGA.

€1,045 and €395 for delegates from industry and academia, respectively, who are non-members of DMG, DGMK, and/or SGA.
