However, because the one-year term of the Presidency is short, it can be difficult to ensure continuity in the policies and planning of the Society, impacting the implementation of longer-term initiatives to improve how MSA carries out its mission and supports its members. Over the past couple of years, MSA has worked to enhance continuity in its governance by involving the Vice-President (incoming President) in discussions and leadership before the autumn transition, which takes place at the annual meeting of the Geological Society of America. The Past President also has an important role in leading or supporting key activities from their year as president. This phased, collaborative transition helps with transfer of knowledge and has been particularly important in the past year as we have all worked together to implement the new Strategic Plan.

Another aspect of continuity that is important to MSA is ensuring the future of the Society. The Strategic Plan that was recently implemented was designed with this as one of its main goals. Part of the implementation of the plan has been the formation of Membership and Early Career Committees, which are focused on providing more ways to support existing members and attract new members. Member benefits have been expanded to include access to *Raman Spectroscopy for Mineral Identification: A Practical Guide* by Paul Bartholomew and Jeffrey Post and online access to the first 40 volumes of the Reviews in Mineralogy & Geochemistry series (from v. 1 Sulfides to v. 40 Sulfates!). Existing benefits include online access to *American Mineralogist* and *Elements*, discounts off MSA's publications, access to the online Member Directory, eligibility to nominate students for the Undergraduate Prize, and much more.

As both of us are metamorphic petrologists, we appreciate the usefulness of coexisting phases that represent different stages of metamorphism. Without implying that any individual is 'relict' or 'metastable', we seek to apply this philosophy to making MSA a proactive, effective, interesting, and fun Society!



IAGOD SUPPORTS THE 10th INTERNATIONAL GEOSCIENCES CONFERENCE OF YOUNG RESEARCHERS, KYIV, UKRAINE

On 23rd and 24th May 2024, the Council of Young Scientists of the Department of Geosciences, National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine hosted the 10th International Geosciences Conference of Young Researchers. The conference was held online and attracted 101 delegates, with 48 scientific presentations from 14 countries worldwide providing an invaluable means for Ukrainian researchers to connect with their international counterparts in spite of the ongoing conflict. Science presented at the conference spanned the fields from petrology, resource geology, paleontology and stratigraphy, geophysics, geoinformatics, hydrology, geomorphology, environmental geology, and sustainable development. Representation from Ukraine included several institutes of the National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine, as well as the Ivano-Frankivsk National Technical University of Oil and Gas, Taras Shevchenko National University of Kyiv, National Transport University, H.S. Skovoroda Kharkiv National Pedagogical University, and the Borys Sreznevsky Central Geophysical Observatory.


