Goldschmidt Conference

The 16th Annual Goldschmidt Conference will take place in Melbourne, Australia, from 27 August to 1 September. The IAGC is a co-sponsor of the meeting, which is convened by the Geochemical Society. Conference themes include geochemical techniques, mineral deposits, the solar system, constraints on timescales, biogeochemistry, aquatic geochemistry, surface processes, and ocean chemistry. ISEG-7

The 7th International Symposium on Environmental Geochemistry (ISEG-7) is to be held from 25 to 30 September 2006 in Beijing, China. IAGC support is being provided for this meeting. The main themes of the conference will be geochemical records of change and contamination, geochemistry and health, fragile habitats (e.g. karst), organic pollutants, coal, water resources, environmental management and analytical geochemistry. Abstracts are due by 30 April and registration by 31 July 2006.

IAGC-Sponsored Sessions at GSA 2006

The following IAGC-sponsored thematic sessions have been proposed for the next Geological Society of America (GSA) meeting to be held in Philadelphia, 22-25 October 2006.

Geochemical Modeling Applications in Ground Water Systems

Chairs: June Mirecki and Russell Harmon

The session focuses on the application of geochemical modeling to identify major organic, inorganic, and isotopic reactions and reaction rates that control ground water quality. Abstracts incorporating geochemical modeling methods to understand water–rock–microbe interactions in pristine and contaminated systems are welcomed.

Sources, Transport, Fate, and Toxicology of Trace Elements in the Environment

Chairs: LeeAnn Munk, David Long, and W. Berry Lyons

Papers are welcome on the study of trace elements in the environment, including sources, transport, controls on mobility, toxicological consequences, ecology (e.g. food web dynamics, as limiting nutrients), and accumulation in sediments and soils.
